Our calendar highlights a different empathy related theme each month. It is designed to help you deepen your understanding of others and to cultivate empathy in your everyday life.

From bridging gaps to dealing with adversity, each month's theme aims to promote inclusivity, growth, communication, and mindful reflection. We suggest you use these themes as stepping stones to plan chapter events and to creatively discover the hows and why of empathy. We have also listed target items or suggested activities - do some of them, all of them, or create your own!

AUGUST

Theme: Getting Situated / Renewing Empathy

Target Items:

- Register your chapter here
- Recruit members using school club fairs

SEPTEMBER

Theme: Mindfulness



Empathy and mindfulness are two powerful practices that, when combined, can enhance your ability to understand and connect with others on a deeper level. Being mindful of your own experiences can also aid in perspective-taking. By understanding your own emotions and reactions, you become better equipped to empathize with others' feelings and reactions.

Target Items:

- To start the year, have each club member take this survey
- Watch this <u>video</u> on the crisis in Ukraine and discuss with your club
- Hold a fundraiser to market and sell the Ukraine Anthology
- Download the free UCLA mindfulness app and get started
- Host and write a letter writing session with the goal of sending these letters to help spread empathy for an event or cause.
 Letter themes can range from spreading empathy to writing supportive and kinds messages to others (even just in your club!)
- Hold a used book sale

OCTOBER

Theme: Symphony of Perspectives

Highlight richness that emerges when diverse perspectives come together harmoniously. It emphasizes the importance of valuing and integrating viewpoints, experiences, and ideas to create a comprehensive understanding of complex issues.



In a symphony, each instrument contributes a unique sound, and together they create a melody. Similarly, in human interactions, when individuals with different backgrounds, cultures, beliefs, and experiences come together, their diverse perspectives create more profound, nuanced understandings.

Theme: Empathy in Communications

Target Items:

- Run a canned food drive to benefit a local shelter

Theme: Self Reflection



JANUARY

Theme: Bridging Gaps


Target Items:

FEBRUARY

Theme: Deepening Avenues of Empathy

Facilitating connection is a key component of empathy. Use this month to research different humanitarian crises both globally, and in your community. Utilize interpersonal dialogue and social connection to individualize and hone in on underprivileged or maginalized individuals to understand the reality of their lives.



Target Items:

- Schedule conversations with Reflect Empathy "Pen Pals" in different countries to learn from their experiences and deepen your empathy
- Run a paint or sidewalk chalk jam highlighting empathy

MARCH

Theme: Promoting Outgroup Empathy

Empathy means stepping into the shoes of another personal to understand their perspectives. Outgroup empathy occurs when one exhibits empathy toward others who are of a different race, have a different religious affiliation, or identify with different gender orientations. Here are some dos and don'ts to cultivate outgroup empathy:

Do:

- Work on perspective taking to better understand the insights of others
- Educate yourself on the cultural experiences of the outgroup you are trying to empathize with
- Avoid stereotyping and making assumptions when interacting with members of the outgroup
- Make social connections, and identify shared interests to seek common ground and build a foundation for empathy to burgeon

Don't:

- Stereotype based on lack of understanding of an outgroup
- Delve into a serious conversation without adequate knowledge or understanding of an outgroup
- Let personal bias affect your personal understanding of an outgroup. Try to minimize your personal bias and seek to keep an open mind of others' experiences
- Promote only one viewpoint. Focus on the understanding multiple sides to a story and build methods of assistance from there

Target Items:

 Engage in a role playing game with your peers, where you step into the shoes of others, to encourage outgroup empathy

APRIL

Theme: Mirroring Empathy

Mirroring empathy involves reflecting and reciprocating emotions and feelings expressed by someone else. By mirroring empathy, you show the other person that you understand and share their emotional experience.

Remember that mirroring empathy is not about imitating or pretending to feel exactly as the other person does. It's about creating a safe and understanding space for them to express their emotions and feel heard and supported. Being authentic and compassionate in your responses will contribute to a more meaningful connection with others.



It involves considering how various forms of discrimination and privilege intersect and compound to shape a person's unique experiences and challenges.

In the context of empathy, being empathetically intersectional means recognizing and understanding these complex identities and experiences, and responding with compassion and support that is sensitive to these various dimensions of a person's life. It's about acknowledging the diverse and layered aspects of someone's identity and validating the impact it has on their lived experiences.
